Health Profile of Prisoners

Prisoners report more disabling conditions, poorer perceptions of health status, & less frequent use of primary healthcare services than the general population.



In addition to disparate health challenges, the justice-involved population suffers from

- → High rates of poverty & unemployment
- ightarrow Unstable housing & homelessness
- → Differing degrees of personal & family problems
- → Limited financial resources & social support

A criminal record, particularly a drug felony conviction, can further bar former prisoners from <u>public housing</u>, receiving <u>public benefits</u>, <u>employment</u> opportunities, & more.
